State of California Grant, Randall Museum Friends Capital Campaign, San Francisco Recreation & Parks Department, San Francisco Board of Supervisors The Randall Museum Friends (RMF), a nonprofit organization providing support and programming to the City's Recreation & Park Department (RPD) in the operation of the Randall Museum, selected ECB to serve as its Project Manager in its cooperative relationship with RPD for the revitalization of the Randall.

The Randall, a much-beloved San Francisco institution, provides hands-on nature-based learning experiences for all ages of City residents, from toddlers enamored of the rabbits, ducks, raccoon and rescued raptors, to adults seeking recreation and training in woodworking, ceramics and the arts.

The renovation project was catalyzed by the successful application that RPD and RMF made to the State of

California for a \$5.4M grant focused on the rebuilding of the Randall's live animal exhibits. RMF raised an additional \$1.7M through a capital campaign to supplement the grant scope.

ECB worked alongside the RPD project management staff and staff of the museum and RMF to manage the design, permitting and construction of a broad range of building improvements (including disabled access), and a comprehensive revisioning of the museum's exhibit offerings.

The revitalized museum re-opened in June 2017 to wildly positive reviews.
